### **Senior FutureFocus**



Pope Counselors have been implementing **FutureFocus** during AO over a six week period -- a series of relevant lessons to help seniors look beyond high school to their futures! The first two lessons focused on the college application process, how to use Naviance for necessary college processes, how to request transcripts/letters of recommendation, and more. These lessons, along with the corresponding Senior Parent Night Presentations, are uploaded in the **Class of 2024 Counseling CTLS** and also on the **Pope** 

### Counseling Website.

The next several **FutureFocus** sessions will be centered on seniors completing **YouScience**, a SKILLS-BASED career assessment to help them discover their strengths and how those can lead them to a great fitting career, in addition to learning good information about who they are, how they interact with others, and how to play to their strengths in the classroom, work, and more. Students who have taken YouScience will be asked to update their profiles by completing new personality and interest inventories so they are up-to-date (the skills-based portions are only available once as these do not generally fluctuate over time). The results from YouScience can be used by seniors for writing college essays, developing resumes with personalized "power adjectives," and simply validating and confirming strengths students already know they have, which can build confidence. Recommenders can also use YouScience results to more accurately and articulately describe students in their letters.

Today, we had a unique opportunity for Seniors to view a live virtual presentation of the **Peach State Tour** – a collaborative presentation from Georgia State, Augusta University, UGA, and GT.

August 31, students will complete YouScience and receive information about using their results.

September 5, students will hear from Herff Jones about ordering caps/gowns, announcements, and other graduation items.

Future lessons will give additional information about two-year/technical colleges/trades/transferring, military, financial aid and scholarships, applying to college in Georgia, and more! Keep watching the Tuesday Telegraph for information on each week's upcoming lessons. Students who are scheduled to be off campus during AO over these weeks (Dual Enrollment, CVA/GAVS, etc.) are welcome to attend however, information will be posted in CTLS for those who are absent.

### **PSAT/NMSQT Testing Information**

Pope High School will be administering the PSAT/NMSQT (National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) the morning of **October 11, 2023**. Pope will pay the fee for **ALL** 9<sup>th</sup> graders to test, and the state of Georgia will pay the fee for **ALL** 10<sup>th</sup> graders. **Juniors will have to pay the \$18 fee to participate in the official PSAT/NMSQT administration** and receive a score report from the College Board. Families of juniors can pay the \$18 fee in MyPaymentsPlus. **The deadline to pay is 4 pm Thursday, August 31<sup>st</sup>.**
