

Pope Dual Enrollment Information Night – September 16th at 7 pm in the PAC

Join us on **Tuesday, September 16th at 7pm in the PAC** for an informational meeting about Georgia's Dual Enrollment program and how we implement the program at Pope. We will cover information about eligibility, various options within the program, benefits, logistical considerations, processes, and much more. Many of our students participate to take core classes, but increasingly, students are seeking career and trade-oriented classes that can lead to official certifications, technical diplomas, and more through the Accelerated Career Diploma (ACD) program. **This meeting is required for any student who wishes to participate in DE for the 2025-26 school year.** Those unable to attend will be able to find a recorded version of the presentation on our website after the meeting. **All families who attend should be sure to complete the attendance log at the conclusion of the meeting.** If you have any questions, please reach out to your counselor!

PSAT/NMSQT Testing Information

Pope High School will be administering the PSAT/NMSQT (National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) the morning of **Thursday, October 16**th.



- 9th and 10th graders: Pope pays the fee for <u>ALL</u> 9th graders and the State of Georgia pays for <u>ALL</u> 10th graders to test. <u>Please note</u>: Freshmen and Sophomores <u>DO NOT</u> register or submit payment to participate in the October 16th PSAT administration. As currently enrolled students, this is automatically completed for them.
- 11th graders: Juniors will have to pay the \$12 fee to participate in the official PSAT/NMSQT administration and receive a score report from College Board. Families of Juniors can pay the PSAT fee in MyPaymentsPlus. The Deadline for Juniors to pay the fee for the PSAT/NMSQT is 4:00 pm Thursday, August 28th.

Not only does taking the PSAT/NMSQT provide excellent feedback to students about their college readiness, it is also good practice for the actual SAT. The **junior year** PSAT/NMSQT result is the test used to enter the <u>National Merit Scholarship</u> and the <u>National Achievement Scholarship</u> Programs.

The PSAT and SAT tests are administered digitally; this means students will need to bring their fully charged laptop and charging cord on test day. For more information about this and why taking the PSAT is important, click <u>HERE</u>.

In support of our School Strategic Plan, Pope will provide PSAT prep to all 10th and 11th graders during AO starting August 12th and ending September 18th. Additional study and test taking tips can be found HERE.

To accommodate the large number of testing participants, a revised bell schedule will be implemented. Specific testing information will be sent through CTLS Parent and posted to the school's website closer to October 16th. For further questions about the PSAT, contact your child's school counselor.



Student Advisory Council

State School Superintendent Richard Woods seeks students in **grades 10-12** to serve on his **2025-2026 Student Advisory Council**. These students will meet with Superintendent Woods to discuss the impact of state policies in the classroom and other education-related issues. They will serve as the Superintendent's ambassadors to their respective schools. The Student Advisory Council will meet four times in person during the school year; meeting dates are listed in the application.

"The Student Advisory Council gives students a real seat at the table," **Superintendent Woods said.** "Each year, I look forward to hearing directly from Georgia students about their experiences in the classroom. Their voices help shape the decisions we make at the state level, and their insights have a lasting impact. I encourage any student who wants to make a difference to apply."

Interested students must complete and submit the <u>application</u> by **September 5**th **at 5 pm.** Selected students will be contacted via email.

Rising Juniors - Important Immunization Information

Per the Georgia Department of Public Health, effective July 1, 2021, children 16 years of age and older, who are entering the 11th grade (including new entrants), must have received one booster dose of the meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MCV4), unless their initial dose was administered on or after their 16th birthday. Please visit this link for a summary of requirements for vaccinations by age.

In accordance with this requirement, all Pope students entering the 11th grade, who were 16 by August 4th, must submit an updated Certificate of Immunization, on GA Form 3231, to the Pope Counseling Office as soon as possible. Students, who are not yet 16 will have 30 calendar days from the student's 16th birthday to provide the updated Certificate of Immunization. Students must meet this requirement, or provide acceptable exemption documentation, for them to be/remain enrolled in school. Students requesting to be exempt from Immunization must present a signed, notarized Affidavit of Religious Objection to Immunization, DPH Form 2208.

We prefer that you upload your updated Certificate of Immunization/Affidavit of Religious Objection to Immunization to ParentVUE. Once logged in, you will click on Change My Information \rightarrow Student Information \rightarrow Enrollment Documents where you will be able to upload the document. Paper and emailed copies will be accepted as well.
