Junior Family Information Night is September 4th

Junior parents/guardians – Save the date! We hope you will join the Counseling Department **September 4**th **at 7 pm** in the Performing Arts Center (PAC) where we will review information to help our 11th graders navigate junior year. Post-secondary planning and the junior timeline will be discussed.

PSAT – Final Reminder for Juniors



Pope will be administering the PSAT the morning of **Thursday**, **October 16**th. All 9th and 10th graders' PSAT fees have been covered by Pope and the State of Georgia. **Juniors**, **however**, **must pay the \$12 PSAT fee through MyPaymentsPlus by THIS THURSDAY**, **AUGUST 28**th at 4:00 pm to participate. If you have any questions about the fee or require financial support, please reach out to your Counselor as soon as possible. No late payments will be accepted for any reason. The PSAT is great practice for juniors who will be taking their first SAT this year. Even if your junior is already taking the actual SAT and

may not need any further practice, the Junior year PSAT is the test used to determine recognition and scholarships through the <u>National Merit Scholarship Program</u> and also through the <u>College Board National Recognition Program</u>, so we recommend all juniors take the PSAT this October.

Senior Parent Night Presentation

If you missed the Senior Parent Night from last week, a copy of the presentation can be found on our Pope School Counseling website here. Senior lessons (FutureFocus) will continue during AO for the next several weeks. Today we live-streamed the Peach State Tour presentation with reps from Georgia State, Augusta, UGA, and Georgia Tech. CCSD ACT Digital Test Takers Must Use Personal Device (BYOD)

ACT Gateway, the online ACT testing software, is <u>not currently supported on CCSD school-managed laptops</u>. Students taking the online ACT will need to take the test on a personal device and ensure that they are registered to BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) for the test center they have chosen. In addition, they will need to download the ACT Gateway software to their personal device and perform the Device Readiness check by the stated deadline for their test date. Please note - Pope is ONLY offering the paper/pencil ACT, so this ONLY applies to students who may be taking the ONLINE ACT at another, non-Pope testing location. For instructions on installing ACT Gateway and ensuring that you are registered for the ACT using the BYOD option, visit this website https://act.org/BYODstudent. 



Join us on **Tuesday, September 16th at 7pm in the PAC** for an informational meeting about Georgia's Dual Enrollment program and how we implement the program at Pope. Student Advisory Council

State School Superintendent Richard Woods seeks students in **grades 10-12** to serve on his **2025-2026 Student Advisory Council**. These students will meet with Superintendent Woods to discuss the impact of state policies in the classroom and other education-related issues. They will serve as the Superintendent's ambassadors to their respective schools. The Student Advisory Council will meet four times in person during the school year; meeting dates are listed in the application.

High School to High Heels Mentoring Program

The National Coalition of 100 Black Women is kicking off this year's High School to High Heels Mentoring Program and extends an invitation to young ladies in grades 8-12 to take advantage of this opportunity. Spearheaded by the Education Committee of the National Coalition of 100 Black Women, the Mentoring Program is an excellent opportunity to meet other young ladies in the community and be mentored by dynamic women committed to providing African American female youth with tools to help them succeed as they complete their high school education and pursue educational goals at the post-secondary level. Participants will engage in activities that promote advocacy for social justice; nurture mind, body, and soul; foster economic empowerment; and establish lifelong social and professional networks. The Program strives to promote leadership skills and increase exposure to careers in STEM, while increasing the number of African American females who attend college and ultimately obtain a bachelor's degree and beyond. The Program runs from September to April and typically meets on the 2nd Saturday of each month at various locations within the service areas. The Mentoring Program will kick off Saturday, September 13th.
