Seniors - Important Reminders

A few important reminders for our seniors! As you are adding colleges that you are applying to in Naviance, don't forget to complete your FERPA waiver in BOTH Naviance (found under About Me→Surveys from your school→25/26 FERPA/Transcript/Recommendation Authorization) AND Common App, if applicable. After adding the Colleges you are applying to, you may request your initial transcript be sent as well.

If you need to request a Counselor Letter of Recommendation, you must first complete your Student Brag Sheet and Resume, and your Parent should complete their Parent Brag Sheet as well. After those items are done, please come into the Counseling Office to request your Counselor Recommendation.

CCSD ACT Digital Test Takers Must Use Personal Device (BYOD)

ACT Gateway, the online ACT testing software, is <u>not currently supported on CCSD school-managed laptops</u>. Students taking the online ACT will need to take the test on a personal device and ensure that they are registered to BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) for the test center they have chosen. In addition, they will need to download the ACT Gateway software to their personal device and perform the Device Readiness check by the stated deadline for their test date. Please note - Pope is ONLY offering the paper/pencil ACT, so this ONLY applies to students who may be taking the ONLINE ACT at another, non-Pope testing location. For instructions on installing ACT Gateway and ensuring that you are registered for the ACT using the BYOD option, visit this website https://act.org/BYODstudent. Sophomore Classroom Counseling Lessons and Family Events



Counselors will be going into 10th grade English classes **Friday and Monday (September 5**th **and 8**th) to have sophomores complete their two state required tasks and discuss the following topics:

- Complete Strengths Explorer Career Assessment in Naviance (state required task)
- Learn about Dual Enrollment and complete the Dual Enrollment Survey in Naviance (state required task)

- What are my options after high school?
- HOPE Scholarship and HOPE Grant
- GAFutures.org career and college planning website

Then in February, we will return to sophomore classes to discuss:

- Graduation Requirements and promotion rules
- Updating their Individualized Graduation Plan (IGP)
- Course registration information for the 2026-27 school year

SAVE THE DATES – 10th Grade Family Events:

All sophomores will be participating in the **PSAT/NMSQT** the morning of Thursday, October 16th. The fee for this test is paid for all 10th graders by the State of Georgia. We will have a **PSAT** Results and College Testing Information meeting, followed by a Sophomore Family Meeting Monday, November 10th starting at 6:30 pm in the PAC.

Leading into course registration for next year, we will host a **Family Course Registration Information Night on Wednesday February 11th at 6:30pm in the PAC.** This meeting is for 9th, 10th and 11th grade families looking for additional guidance and insight into the course registration and planning process. We will share information that will help you and your child plan a challenging but balanced approach to course selections. School Counselors will be available in the PAC lobby after the presentation to answer additional questions you/your child may have about their course selection.

Most family's questions are answered by attending the meetings above, but should you/your child have additional questions about course selection/planning for the upcoming year and beyond, you can sign up to attend one of our **9**th **and 10**th **Grade Advisement Evenings on February 23**rd **or 25**th. This event takes place in the Learning Commons and is **by appointment only. Sign up information will be sent out closer to the event.** This event is structured as a "round-robin" format where approximately 15 families during a 30-minute time slot will have an opportunity to speak with teacher representatives from core and elective departments. You speak with whomever you wish depending on what your questions may be (i.e. differences between on-level, honors, AP, elective course choices, how to help your student have balance, etc.). Several counselors will also be in attendance to answer your "big picture" questions based on your student's college/career goals. **These conversations will need to be limited so that everyone attending each time slot has a chance to get their questions answered.**



Join us on **Tuesday, September 16th at 7pm in the PAC** for an informational meeting about Georgia's Dual Enrollment program and how we implement the program at Pope. We will cover information about eligibility, various

options within the program, benefits, logistical considerations, processes, and much more. Many of our students participate to take core classes, but increasingly, students are seeking career and trade-oriented classes that can lead to official certifications, technical diplomas, and more through the Accelerated Career Diploma (ACD) program. 

High School to High Heels Mentoring Program

The National Coalition of 100 Black Women is kicking off this year's High School to High Heels Mentoring Program and extends an invitation to young ladies in grades 8-12 to take advantage of this opportunity. Spearheaded by the Education Committee of the National Coalition of 100 Black Women, the Mentoring Program is an excellent opportunity to meet other young ladies in the community and be mentored by dynamic women committed to providing African American female youth with tools to help them succeed as they complete their high school education and pursue educational goals at the post-secondary level. Participants will engage in activities that promote advocacy for social justice; nurture mind, body, and soul; foster economic empowerment; and establish lifelong social and professional networks. The Program strives to promote leadership skills and increase exposure to careers in STEM, while increasing the number of African American females who attend college and ultimately obtain a bachelor's degree and beyond. The Program runs from September to April and typically meets on the 2nd Saturday of each month at various locations within the service areas. The Mentoring Program will kick off Saturday, September
