




Senior Reminder - Graduation Information Form & FutureFocus Feedback

Seniors are also asked to provide their feedback from the FutureFocus series. Scan the QR code to complete the FutureFocus Senior Survey with your insights to the program.



Junior Advisement - Sign Up Today!

During Junior year, families and students are invited to meet with their counselor for an individual 30-minute advisement session regarding remaining graduation requirements and post-secondary plans. You are now able to sign up for a Junior Advisement Appointment with your student's counselor. The bulk of the appointment slots run from Friday, October 24 through mid-December. However, there are also some available appointment slots/days in early October. Please click on the link next to your assigned alpha counselor to take you directly to a Bookings page and follow the instructions. We encourage you to book a time that coincides with your student's lunch or maybe an elective period if possible. Students will be responsible for making up any work that is missed. We look forward to meeting with you. If you missed the Junior Parent Meeting earlier this year, you can find the presentation at www.popeschoolcounseling.com/11th-grade/. As a reminder, please bring a copy of your student's Social Security card to this meeting. This will be helpful in allowing you and your student to gain access to their personal HOPE Scholarship information. Additionally, please be sure to park in a VISITOR parking spot or there is a risk that you will get a ticket if you park in a student/teacher parking spot.
