
Pope College Fair - TOMORROW - Last One of the Semester

Scholarship Opportunities

Watch this space each week for important scholarship information! Various opportunities will be highlighted in the Tuesday Telegraph but additional scholarships are also posted in Naviance and can be found on the Pope School Counseling website. In Naviance go to Colleges —> Scholarships & Money. There you can search for national scholarships, college-specific scholarships, as well as numerous other scholarships that are available to our seniors (and sometimes even juniors)!

The Marietta-Roswell Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority is now accepting applications for their annual Scholarship Program, supporting African-American female high school seniors who excel in academics, leadership, and service. Eligible students are encouraged to apply early and begin requesting transcripts and recommendations now to avoid last-minute delays.



The Coolidge Scholarship is a FULL-RIDE, merit scholarship that covers a student's tuition, room, board, and expenses for four years of undergraduate study. This one-of-a-kind scholarship may be used at *any* accredited college or university in the U.S. and is open for JUNIORS to apply! Academic excellence is the primary criterion, along with an interest in public policy and an appreciation of the values President Coolidge championed. Candidates should also have a record of genuine service to their community. Applications must be submitted by **December 16**th and can be found at Coolidge Scholars.

The Hagan Scholarship is a nationwide need-based merit scholarship, providing recipients with the opportunity to achieve their goals and graduate college debt-free! The scholarship provides \$2,000 to help pay for essential items to attend college and up to \$7,500 each semester for up to 8 consecutive semesters (that's \$60,000!). Free workshops, Free Schwab Brokerage Accounts, and Free Study Abroad provide recipients with a practical understanding of important life skills not typically covered in the school curriculum. Students who meet the criteria can learn more here. Applications are due by **December 1**st.



The Cobb Schools Foundation Scholarship will be accepting applications until January 31, 2026. Two graduating seniors from each of the 17 Cobb County high schools will be awarded a \$2,000 scholarship to support their higher education. The scholarships recognize academic excellence, leadership, and community involvement.
